Charitable

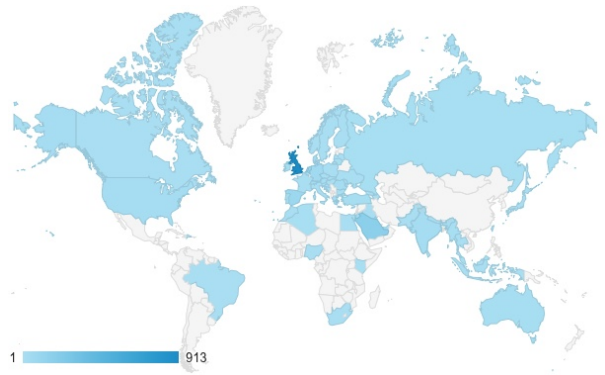
Ebrain is not for profit, it is owned by the neuroscience specialties through the Joint Neurosciences Council which is a UK registered charity. No clinicians have been paid and there is no commercial sponsorship.

Usage

There are 8356 accounts. In the last month 1,700 sessions have been accessed by 635 users that's a total of 22,712 pages. 68.9% are returning visitors.

Most usage is from UK (>50%) and Europe (>75%), however, the map opposite shows the location of all ebrain learners from the last month.

Ebrain is free to health care professionals from HINARI countries.
